## 56<sup>th</sup> Annual Show: August 16, 17 & 18<sup>th</sup>, 2019

We only have one feature this year, but it's going to be a doozy! The "Great Minneapolis Feature" will include Minneapolis and Minneapolis-Moline items. There are 13-14 Minneapolis steam traction engines expected, (including a 45 hp compound engine), several prairie tractors, 2 threshers and an amazing collection of Minneapolis paper memorabilia. On the Minneapolis-Moline front, there is a new Minneapolis-Moline building (see p. 5) on the grounds, thanks to member Jean Brew. The feature will actually be spread out over the grounds more than usual. There will be exhibits at the Feature Building, inside and out, more exhibits at the new Minneapolis-Moline building and still more out in the steam engine area. Be sure to check them all out, and we will certainly have an extra special parade as well. Remember that **worker passes** will be required for people helping with exhibits or working for vendors. Exhibitors and vendors **must sign these passes**, otherwise the helper will be required to pay admission to enter. Helpers should enter by the south gate.

New this year, also at the south gate, **all exhibitors and vendors (including handicapped) who bring their own golf cart or ATV** must register at the south gate this year. They will need proof of insurance, and must pay \$5 at the gate, including handicapped persons. They will receive a numbered tag to display on their personal vehicle. ATVs cannot be larger than golf cart size (5'x 10'). Power chairs, and wheelchairs are exempt.

Workers must have a red pass, signed by the vendor or exhibitor they are working with **Also, new this year, campers or exhibitors with their own golf cart or similar personal vehicle will be required to fill out a form, pay \$5, and get a number tag to attach to their cart. Handicapped people are not exempt.** Power chairs or wheelchairs are exempt. There will also be a security guard at the south gate this year. The gate opens at noon on Wednesday, when camping starts, and will open at 6 a.m. Thurs. – Sun. **Call Robert Coates (608) 770-1223** for more info and sign up for a shift.

# **Golf Cart Rental and Personally Owned Cart Registration**

**Rental:** Rental carts will be available again this year. Per day rentals are \$75 for 2-passenger carts, and \$125 for 4-passenger carts. Carts may be reserved in advance by calling Allen Steele at (608)963-0574, after 6 p.m. A driver's license is required. Reserved carts will be held until 10 a.m. after which they will be up for grabs if not claimed. Personally Owned Transport: All Show attendees, members, food vendors, exhibitors, handicapped, and workers who bring their personal golf carts, UTVs and ATVs will pay a \$5 fee, must have proof of insurance, valid driver's license. They will receive a numbered tag which must be displayed prominently on the vehicle. Vehicles cannot be larger than golf cart size -5'x10'. Power chairs, and wheelchairs are exempt. Exhibitors, members, food vendors, and workers will enter at the South Exhibitor Gate and will be checked in there. Attendees who enter at the Main Gate should go to the Gulf Cart Rental Booth to register there or at the Office. Help is needed in the Golf Cart area, especially the personally owned vehicles area. Steve Roudebush welcomes anyone who could help split wood Saturday at 6 a.m. Al Riddle is still looking for stick picker uppers. Mower people needed Saturday before the show, and the striping crew is also needed before the show. The Railroad reported a \$1000. donation by Herb Miller. Also, Statz donated a baggage cart. The Minneapolis feature will include a 1/6 scale threshing rig. Bathrooms and shower areas need painting. Motion was made to pay Allen Steele for copies of our bylaws and 501c3 to be available to members. Second by Don Evenson, MC.
