This along with many other aquisitions set Allis to be an industrial giant. At this year's show you will see various pieces of equipment that Allis built including tractors and farm equipment, crawler tractors and construction equipment, refrigerators, chain saws, lawn mowers, electric motors and more. We are especially proud to have the HD-41 Crawler weighing 120,000 pounds, and items from the La Crosse Plow Company which became part of Allis Chalmers in 1929. Did you know that up to twenty years ago, almost all breakfast cereal was made in the Allis Chalmers Mills?

**South Exhibitor Gate:** Help is needed to check that only campers, exhibitors, and workers come in this way. Campers are required to have an exhibit. Window passes are given to campers and exhibitors so they cam be identified more easily when they go out and return. Workers must have a red pass, signed by the vendor or exhibitor they are working with. Campers or exhibitors with their own golf cart will be required to fill out a form, pay \$5.00 and get a numbered tag to attach to their cart. Handicapped people are not exempt. Power chairs and wheelchairs are exempt. The gate opens at noon Wednesday when camping starts, and will open at 6 a.m. Thursday-Sunday. These One Inch Scale Models were all hand crafted long before scale lumber, plastics and mass-produced modeling products were available. After his death, his friend Guy Florenza of Rockford obtained this circus and many more of his customer produced models. Mr. Florenza wanted people to be able to experience these pieces and decided an exhibit where thousands of people could view these models allowing many people to enjoy these works of art.
