A little history of my Farmall Regular1935 F12 pictured. My best friend Dave Sniader purchased this tractor when he was in junior high...mid 70's. This was the first tractor he ever purchased. He continued to buy tractors including: Waterloo Boy, oil pull, Avery steam engine, 40-80 Avery prairie tractors, Fordsons, multiple IH tractors and others. I helped him restore all of his tractors and showed them at multiple shows over the years with him. He passed away a few years ago and his sisters auctioned off all his tractors. The R.H. Sheppard Company was founded in 1937 by Mr. R.H. Sheppard when he purchased a one story factory in Hanover, PA where the diesel engines could be developed. The first diesels were produced experimentally as early as 1933. The engines were produced from the 1930's to 1963 to power generator-sets, pumps, life boats, rescue craft, refrigeration cars and farm tractors. In 1949, the company conceived the idea of repowering a Farmall M International farm tractor with a 3-cylinder Sheppard Diesel. These tractors were produced until 1956, when a recession coupled with floor planning by IH and Ford made the production uneconomical and they were discontinued. The Graham Bradley tractor is one of the many lesser known that came and went during the agricultural race in the first half of the century. The tractor has a strong following of admirers who love the look and features that the tractor brought to the industry. Very few of these tractors were produced, but for its time was a gorgeous design and exemplifies the art deco style of the time period. Show Week Schedule — — - Help is Needed !

Pre-show Help: Beginning on the Saturday before the show (Aug.12th), there is a lot of work to be done. Mowing, moving machinery, cleaning buildings and restrooms, setting up and wiping down chairs, benches and tables, parking lot, flea market, and featured prep plus more.

Show Help: Sign up on the Job Chart in the Office.

Camping: Only exhibitors and full time show workers are allowed to camp during the weekend. Register online or contact Grace Schellenberger 608-393-5776.

Admission: Red worker passes are required for people helping exhibitors or vendors and are obtained in the office. Exhibitors and vendors must sign these passes or the helper will be required to pay admission to enter. Helpers must enter at the south gate and show the pass. Admission is \$10.00 per day per adult and children 12 and under enter free with a paid adult. Persons age 65 and older are free with proof of your membership card and driver's license. **Exhibitors only sign in at the office and Flea Market Vendors only sign in at the gate.**

South Exhibitor Gate: Help is needed to check in only campers, exhibitors and workers that come through this gate. Campers are required to have an exhibit; not just their camper. Workers must have red passes signed by the vendor or exhibitor they are working with. Campers and vendors with their own golf cart **(no riding lawn mowers)** are required to fill out a form and pay \$5.00, and get a numbered tag to attach to their cart. Handicapped people are not exempt. Power chairs and wheelchairs are exempt. The gate opens at noon Wednesday when camping begins, and will open daily at 6:00 am, Thursday-Sunday.
