# 61st Annual Show August 16,17,18, 2024

We only have one feature this year, and it's going to be a big one ! This year's Case feature is shaping up quite nicely. The feature committee has been working with the J. I. Case Heritage Foundation who is having their 38th Case Exposition at our show. Exhibitors from across the state and country will have many rare and unique pieces on display and live demonstrations. Some items to be sure and check out include the 30-60 hp oil tractor, Case automobiles, and two rare steam engines that will be on display in the feature building. Several operating steam engines that are not regularly at the show will be hauled in for this event as well.

Prairie tractors, cross motors, letter series, hundred/30/70/90 and 94 series as well as implements from all generations will be covering the acreage around the feature building. Garden tractors, models and memorabilia are planned to be on display.

## Field Trip April 4th

Sixteen club members attended a talk by Matt Maroon, CEO of C-Motive Technologies to learn about electro-static motors. Over the last decade this Madison-based company has expanded Ben Franklin's ideas and created 1/2HP plus motors with drive voltages of 3 phase, 900 volts, and a proprietary dielectric fluid moving printed charged plates. These motors use less resources and are 35% more efficient because they are far easier to fabricate than coils and ironware motors, and high voltage means low current, low heat ! Just as an electrostatic ally charged balloon sticks to a wall, these motors can hold a loaded position with virtually no energy losses (0.2% full power) making their application to robotics an exciting opportunity. Thank you Sally Leong for organizing the trip.
